The Assumption

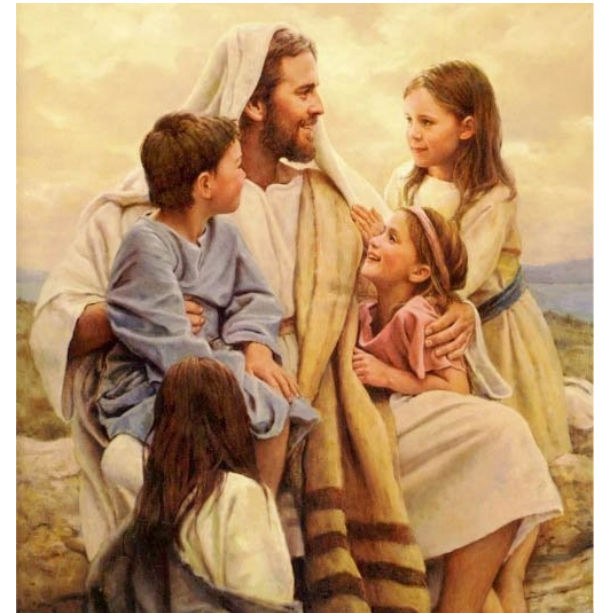

THE JOYFUL MYSTERIES (JESUS' EARLY LIFE)

The Annunciation

The archangel Gabriel appeared to Mary to ask her to be the mother of Jesus. Mary said, "yes". You and I can say, "yes" to God by doing God's will in the little things. Each time we avoid sin, listen and obey our parents, or treat others with kindness, we are being like Mary and saying, "yes" to God.

The Visitation

Mary went to visit her cousin Elizabeth who was pregnant with St. John the Baptist. Mary gives us a good example of service. God wants us to serve one another with love. This means looking for ways to do things for others without being asked and without expecting anything in return.

The Nativity

During this mystery of the rosary we think about Christmas, Jesus' birthday! We think about Jesus, Mary, and Joseph in the stable, the star, the wise men, and more. Jesus is God the Father's gift to us. We give gifts to God by going to Mass, not complaining, and following the Ten Commandments.

The Presentation of the Lord

After Mary and Joseph received Jesus at the Nativity, they offered Jesus back to God. It's like when you get a big basket of candy for Easter and you are happy to share it with your family. This mystery teaches us to be generous with others and God. You can't beat God in a generosity contest!!

The Finding in the Temple

Mary and Joseph thought Jesus was with His friends so they didn't realize He was missing until they were almost home. They knew ex-

actly where to find Jesus, in the Temple. The Temple was like our Parish Church. We will always find Jesus there waiting for us in the Tabernacle.

The Baptism of Jesus in the Jordan

Many of us don't remember our baptism because we were babies. Baptism washes away all of our sins and makes us children of God. God the Father spoke at Jesus' baptism saying, "*this is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.*" He says the same thing about you and me because we are now His children. Let's remember our baptism each time we bless ourselves with Holy Water.

The Transfiguration

At the transfiguration Peter, James, and John get to see Jesus as He looks in Heaven. I'm sure it changed them and made them excited to go to Heaven. The Institution of the Eucharist

At the Last Supper, Jesus gave the Apostles their First Holy Communion. Jesus wanted to stay with us in a special way here on Earth and so He gave us the Mass and His Body & Blood in Holy Communion. Let's take time each day to thank Jesus for these great gifts!!

THE SORROWFUL MYSTERIES (JESUS' TIME OF SUFFERING)

The Agony in the Garden

"Not my will, but your will be done." This is the prayer Jesus prayed when he was alone and afraid in the Garden. It's a good prayer for us to pray when we are starting something new, scared, or afraid. If we pray this prayer with all of our heart, God the Father will comfort us.

The Scourging at the Pillar

The Crowning with Thorns

The soldiers made a painful crown of thorns and put it on top of Jesus' head.
